- multiplication/division flashcards (up to 12 X 12)
- 50 index cards (white lined)
- 2 composition books (instead of notebooks) 9 3/4" x 7 1/2"
- one graph paper notebook (spiral bound)
- Ruler (inches, centimeters)
- 2 or 3 Rubber erasers (no collectibles/toy erasers)
- 1 box crayons (please put in zip lock bag with name on it)
- 1 box colored pencils (please put in zip lock bag with name on it)
- Individual pencil sharpener (Staples brand sharpens well)
- 1 pair of scissors
- 6 glue sticks
- 3" Post it Notes
- 3 erasable pens
- 3 folders (no bulky trapper keepers/binders)
- Pencil bag (no big pencil holders/boxes)
- 4 extra large book covers (brown paper bags can be used)
- 1 box of tissues
- 1 Wet One
- 1 box of Latex free bandaids
- 1 box of gallon sized ziplock bags
- 1 box of sharpened pencils (at least 50) Have your child bring these to school and we will designate a place in the classroom they can store them so that they will always have a pencil.

You should be able to do this in 5 minutes. You will be given a subtraction and addition drill the first week we return from summer vacation. These drills will be graded and will be the first math grades you receive in the third grade. We find that one of the best ways for students to practice their facts is by taking written drills since this is the way that they will be assessed and graded in class.
