

## 6th Grade Summer Reading Book Report Ideas

Read **one** book from the summer reading list below. Then, choose one book report format to complete. Please bring it with you on the first day of school. This is a homework grade. You will be sharing with your classmates. Reading is traveling without leaving home. Enjoy your travels!

1. Think of an important scene from the book and create a **diorama** that illustrates this scene. **Include a paragraph on the back** explaining the event from the book.
2. Make up your own **quiz** for the book. Have at least 15 questions (multiple choice, fill in the blank, short answer, true/false, matching, etc.) Be sure to include an **answer key**.
3. Write an **essay** explaining what things you would like to change about the story.
4. Write a **letter** to the author telling him/her what parts you enjoyed the most about the story. The letter must be **at least three paragraphs**.
5. Retell the major plot (problem) points of the story in a **comic strip** format.
6. Make a **collage** (words and pictures) relating to the book and its characters.
7. Illustrate a **book jacket** (front and back cover) for the book. Your illustration must be completely different from the actual cover. Don't forget to include a summary.
8. Come up with a minimum of 10 **interview questions** for one of the characters in the book and then give his/her answers.
9. Make a list of at least **8 important things** that you learned from reading this book. Be sure to explain each one.
10. If you enjoy technology, make a book trailer. Then, email it to me.

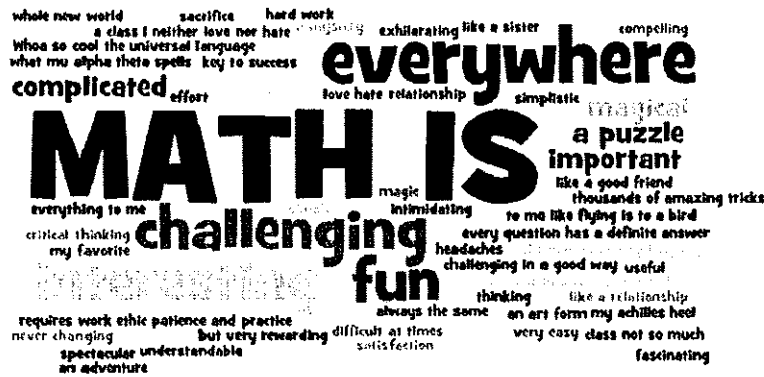
