

Happy New Year and welcome back! I truly hope that the Christmas vacation allowed you to relax and enjoy some family fun. I have heard from many of the children who had great times both at home and on family vacations. Their stories of the gifts Santa left and the fun of playing all week long were wonderful to hear. It was also nice to hear the children talk about attending Christmas Eve or Christmas Day Mass at our parish.

Ski & Board Club is up and running on Tuesdays after school. Mr. Diaz and about sixty students from grades 3-8 are participating in this great, six-week program. The program runs right up until February vacation.

It always feels like the first four months of school are the most difficult. The children and teachers are getting to know each other, there are few days off and the seasons change so quickly resulting in coughs and colds. As a reminder, we will always attempt outdoor recess if the weather allows. Freezing temperatures will always result in indoor recess, but students should be dressed properly each day with jackets, hats and mittens/gloves to ensure they are prepared should we go outside for recess. Also, we heat the classrooms comfortably to sixty-eight degrees. Students are welcome to wear their <u>uniform</u> sweatshirt in class if they are cold.

Our MAP (Measure of Academic Progress) standardized testing program returns Jan. 13-Feb.10. All students in K-8 participate in testing as required by the Archdiocese of Boston. Teachers will reach out to let families know which days students will test. You can help your child be successful by making sure he/she is well-rested and has a good breakfast the day of testing.

In addition to the learning that will be taking place in the upcoming weeks we are also making final plans to celebrate Catholic Schools Week (United in Faith & Community Theme and will run Jan. 26-31). A specific schedule will be handed out by your child's classroom teacher so please be sure to keep an eye out for the activities we are planning.

Term II ended on January 16<sup>th</sup> and Report Cards will be live on Renweb on January 24. Should you ever have questions regarding grades, please know you can always reach out directly to a teacher. Email is the best form of communication due to their very busy schedules. If you feel a conference is needed, please email.

Do you know someone who is interested in sending their child to St. Michael School? We are hosting an Open House on Thursday, January 30<sup>th</sup> at 10 a.m. Families will have an opportunity to tour the school while classes are in session to get a feel for the school and administration will be available for questions. 












Happy New Year to all! I hope everybody had a happy and healthy holiday season. I know that the vacation was extra long this year, but it was nice to have this time to relax.
























## Counselor's Corner With Mrs. Rowley
